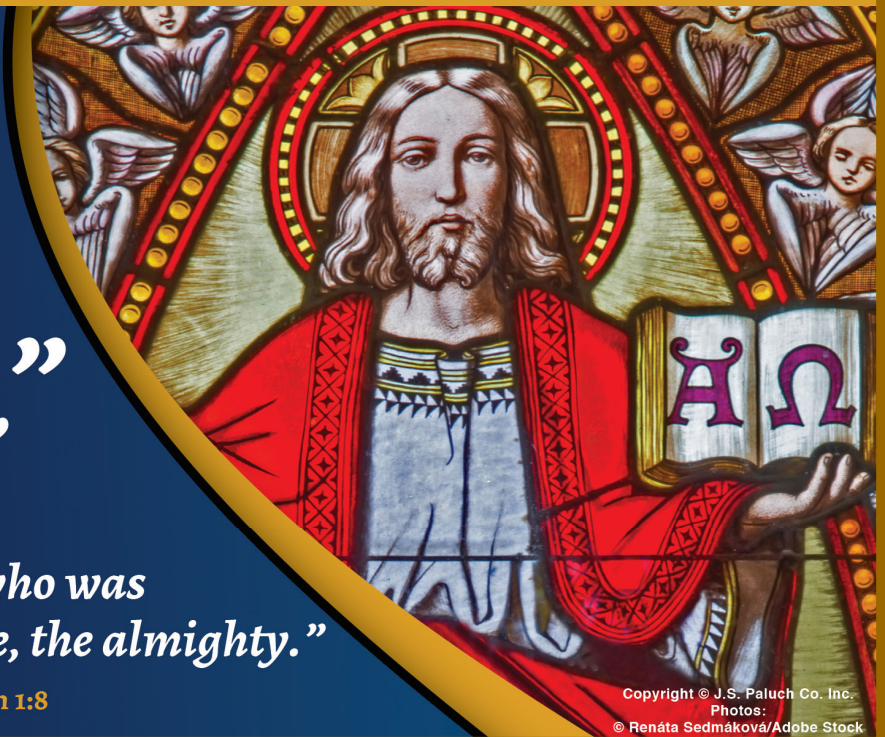

***Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe***  
**Reflections on Today's Readings:**



**FOCUS:** Jesus, King of heaven and earth, cares for all His people and calls us to love and serve Him in return. This final Sunday in Ordinary time is marked as the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus, our King, has all power in heaven and earth. The Church represents the kingdom on earth. We, as members of that kingdom, are expected to follow the example of Jesus. He rules with love, service and compassion, and calls us to do the same.

**LITURGY OF THE WORD:** All of today's readings address the idea of kingship. Daniel's vision sees the king in everlasting glory being served by all nations. The second reading names the King as Jesus Christ and affirms His reign as absolute and everlasting. John's Gospel relays the exchange between Jesus and Pilate before His crucifixion, where Jesus confirms His kingdom is not of this world.
