

POPE FRANCIS INTENTIONS 2022

For true human fraternity

We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

JOURNEY TOWARD GOD

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you.

Isaiah 60:1

In our celebration of the Epiphany, two interwoven themes are present in the readings today. God is beginning something new, and God gathers all of humanity to participate. For Isaiah, God's bright light, manifested in the people of Israel, attracts and summons people from many nations to Jerusalem. In the letter to the Ephesians, God's grace makes the Gentiles co-heirs and co-partners in the Gospel. Matthew tells the story of the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel through the birth of Jesus, and simultaneously leading foreigners to share in these same promises. With the birth of Jesus, God chose a particular people, in a particular time and place, to enter most directly into the human story. Today's readings teach that God did this in order to gather all people, all cultures, into unity with God. Like the Magi, we are drawn into a journey toward God, becoming co-partners in God's work.

EPIPHANY TRADITION

The chalking of the door in one's home is a centuriesold practice throughout the world. It is an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit them there.

The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2022 — is simple: take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home:



The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

PRAY

In the Gospel today we hear that the Magi traveled far to find the Savior Jesus Christ. We see that the bright star drew them in and led the way to where they found the Savior of the World. They brought gifts to share.

Find a quiet place in your home to sit and open your heart to seek Jesus.

What do you want to give to Jesus?

When you are ready, find something in your home that symbolizes the gift you want to give

Him and bring it to a special prayer space in your home.

Talk with Jesus about the gift you are giving Him and why you chose to bring Him that gift. Quietly meditate and listen for what Jesus says to you in this time of prayer.



TALK

Have each member in your household make a star out of construction paper.

Take some time to think about the beautiful gifts the Magi brought to baby Jesus. They were precious gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Each of us have been given gifts and talents that we share with others.

What gifts do you have to share?

After sharing, place the stars in a significant place in your home where you will see them frequently and be reminded of all the beautiful gifts you want to share.




