

IN MEMORY OF FR. THOMAS KING



Dear Families and Friends,

I am writing to express to you my greatest sympathy and assurance of prayers during this time as we all cope with the passing of our beloved Fr. Tom King. We were all saddened upon hearing of his passing last week, and once again, we are mindful of the shortness and brevity of this life, even for those who have served with such distinction and honor as Fr. Tom.

We have seen many times the profound impact he had on so many families and individuals in our parish, in our school, and I think especially on our children who always impatiently waited for Fr. Tom close to the sacristy to get lollipops, which Fr. Tom always had ready to give to our kids. Fr. Tom was known for sharing many lovely stories during his homilies and was even known as "Fr. 45," for almost always being able to celebrate Mass in 45 minutes.

In his time as a Pastor of St. Anastasia, from July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2010, Fr. Tom celebrated Masses, baptized children, blessed marriages, listened to confessions, preached the Word of God, served the sick, celebrated funerals, built the Kingdom of God in our community. Fr. Tom worked hard with the Parish Council on a vision to someday build a new Parish Center. Unfortunately, his great dream was not fulfilled due to the financial crisis of 2008. His dream continues to live on in each of us and we pray someday to fufill his legacy.

Fr. Tom loved St Anastasia so much that even after his retirement and moving back to his family home in Venice, he still maintained himself involved in helping the next pastors in their ministries. He would always say that St. Anastasia was his home parish. I believe his good work, dedication, his love for St. Anastasia's community, faithfulness to God, and his priestly vocation is a great inspiration to all of us. Our beloved Fr. Tom King lived and followed the example of Christ, and in turn, became a powerful example of what God can do through a life yielded to Him. I know that if he were able to speak to us once again, he would share with us Jesus' words: "Don't be troubled, there is much room in the Kingdom for us all."

I want to remind you that there is no weight of the soul that our Savior Jesus Christ cannot help you bear. He is with us and wants us to trust in him as we cope with our sorrow. Never forget to allow him into your heart so that he may heal your wounds and relieve your pain. As Jesus says to all of us, "Let not your heart be troubled: you believe in God, believe also in me."

Let us pray that the Lord will give us his consolation and his peace at this time of grief and sadness. May God provide his compassion in abundance to us as we struggle with this loss. Finally, may God help us all to live the many faith lessons that Fr. Tom so generously taught, shared, and lived while he ministered to us. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Grab your Bible and look up the Gospel reading <u>Gospel - Luke 6:27-38</u>

PRAY

For your time of prayer, you will need: paper, pencil, eraser

- Begin with the Sign of the Cross. On the center of the paper, draw a heart. In the center of the heart, quickly write down the names of the people you love.
- 2. Write down the names of people (or groups of people) who you do not love or find difficult to love outside of the heart.



- 3. Once you've finished writing the names, put downyour pencil and reread the Gospel. Sit quietly and ponder the words of Jesus.
- 4. Talk to Jesus about his words. Are his teachings easy to do? Why or why not?
- 5. As you reflect on the Gospel and talk to Jesus about it, slowly erase the heart you drew. Pray as you erase the boundary. Ask Jesus to help you who are outside of your heart.
- 6. Once the heart is erased, draw a new, larger heart that enfolds all the names on your paper.
- 7. Amen.

TALK


